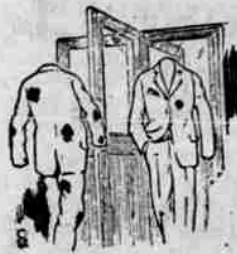
A. W. O. L's Invading The Klamath Country
