EVIDENCE AGAINST SHEPHERD GAINING

CHICAGO, June 13.—(United Press)—"We gave them a bad jolt today and we're going to give them some more of the same thing," State's Attorney Robert E. Crowe told the United Press tonight, in commenting on testimony introduced at the William D. Shepherd, \$1,000,000 germ murder trial.

Crowe took Shepherd's defense by surprise at the short Saturday session of court, when he placed Dr. Amante Rongetti, director of a medical school, on the stand, and drew from him the charge that Shepherd had questioned him concerning typhoid fever germs.

Dr. Rongetti told how Shepherd came to his school about one year before Billy died of typhoid fever, and asked how typhoid germs were injected into the human body.

Shepherd, smiling and confident during the early part of that trial, became suddenly alert when Rongetti told his story. He shifted uneasily, held short whispered conversations with his attorneys, and glanced anxiously at the judge to see how Rongetti's testimony was being accepted.
