BUNNELL SLAPS ON HEAVY FINE

James Farrell, alleged partner of James Matte who was recently convicted of liquor possession, was given a fine of \$150 by County Judge Bunnell late yesterday afternoon for the same offense. The arrest and fine of Farrell, who pleaded guilty, is expected to have an effect on the appeal of Matte from the \$250 fine given him by Justice Hanaker at Bonanza. According to deputy sheriffs the two men were partners and Farrell used the same car for transportation of liquor as Farrell.

Judge Bunnell will serve as justice of the peace for about 10 days, until Justice Hunsaker returns from the Richardson sanitarium at the Chico hot springs, where he left yesterday for his health.

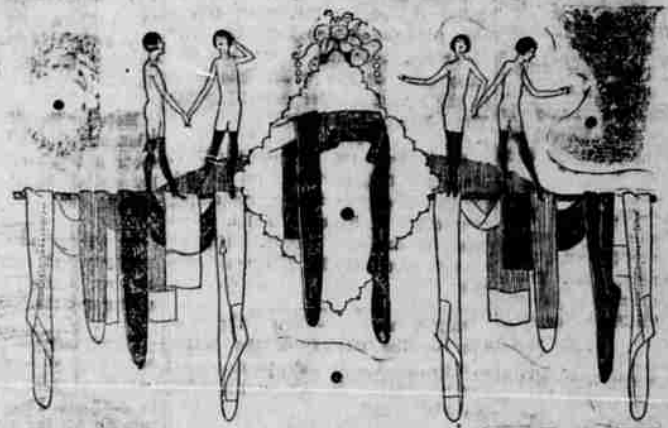

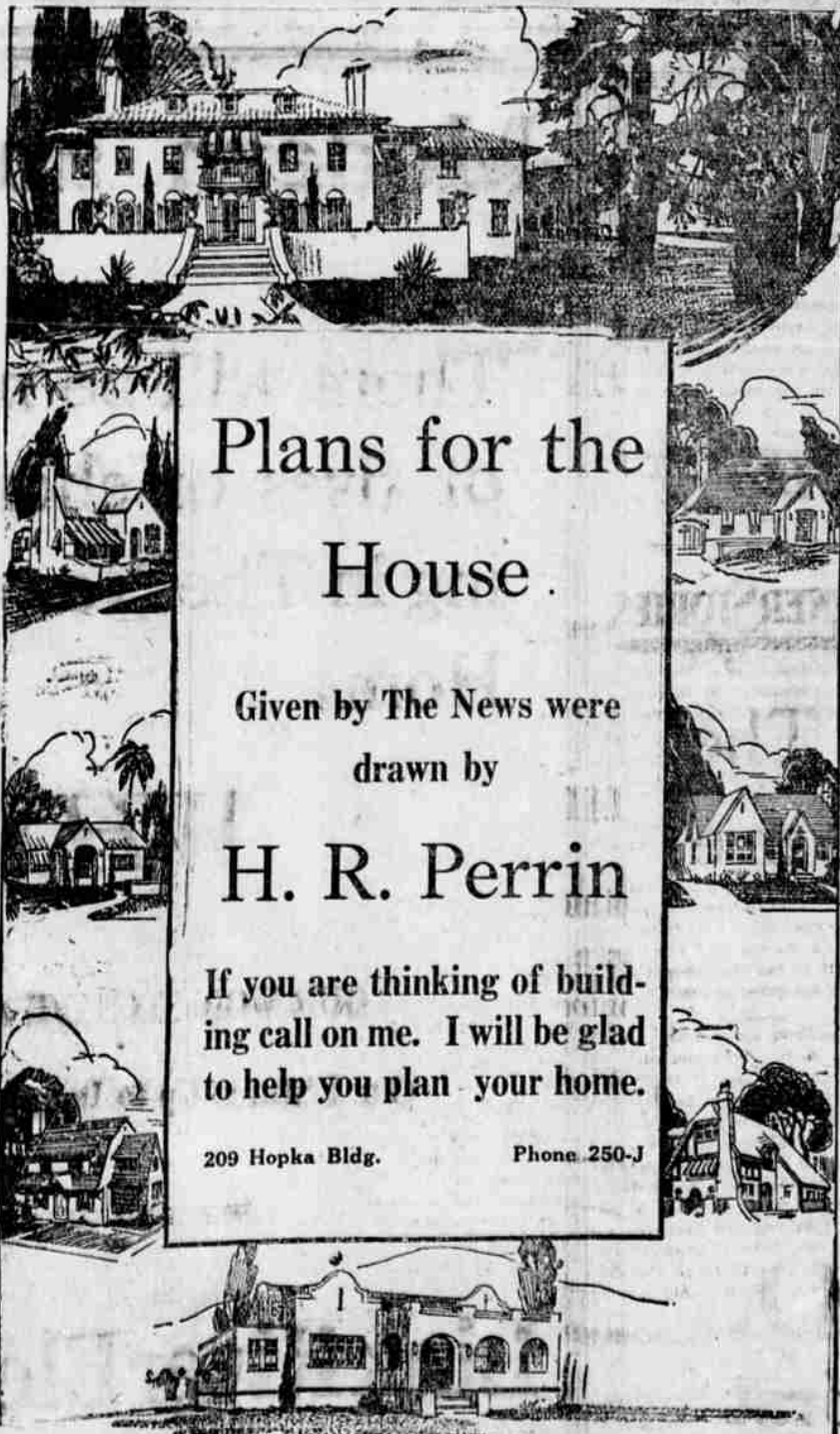
