Married Men With **Incomes Less Than** \$4,000 To Be Aided

Smoot Fights for Reduction Of Small Salaried Men's Income Taxes

WASHINGTON, June 16 .- Relief from federal income taxes may be afforded married men with incomes congressional tax experts said yes-

Chairman Smoot of the senate finance committee, is one of a group of members of the upper body in favor of the plan.

"Any man who earns \$4,000 or more a year," said Smoot, "ought to be willing to chip in \$5 or \$10 toward running his government. Tax paying is a patriotic duty, and I don't see how any one with such an income could object to donating such a small portion of it to his ountry each year."

Upon the amount of taxes paid Monday-the date of the second installments depends the possibility of eliminating the income levy on married men who earn less than \$4,000. Treasury officials expect payments to aggregate \$350,000,000. treasury will close the fiscal year. June 30, with a surplus running \$100,000,444. This amount together with the expected surplus of \$276,000,000 for the next fiscal year, will furnish funds for the reduction in married men's income
