RESOLUTION

The City Engineer, pursuant to resolution of the Common Council heretofore adopted on June 15th, 1925, having filed plans, specifications and estimates of the cost of improving Lincoln street from 11th street easterly to the Linkville Cemetery, together with intersections not paved, together with turnouts, and the council having taken same under advisement and finding said plans, specifications and estimates to be satisfactory.

IT IS THEREFORE HEREBY RESOLVED that said plans, specifications and estimates for the improvement of said portion of said street be and the same are hereby approved; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Common Council hereby declares its intention to improve said portion of said street in accordance with said plans, specifications and estimates. Said improvement shall consist of paving said portion of said street with concrete pavement, asphaltic concrete pavement, or Warrentite bitulithic with bituminous concrete base, at an estimated cost, including gutters, curbing, drainage, turnouts and sidewalks, of \$5,025.50 for either of specified improvements; or, Warrentite bitulithic pavement with concrete base, or concrete pavement with asphaltic concrete base, at an estimated cost of \$5,409.50, said improvement in either event, to include grading, rolling, curbing and sidewalks, and said pavement in either event to be twenty-five (25) feet wide, with concrete sidewalks on both sides thereof.

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED that the Common Council hereby declares its intention to improve said portion of said street in accordance with said plans, specifications and estimates, to-wit: All of block 14, and lots 1, 2, 3, 6, 7 and 8 of block 15, Original Town of Klamath Falls, Oregon, and that said property above described be and the same hereby is declared to be benefited and assessed for the cost of said improvement; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Monday, the 20th day of July, 1925, at the hour of 8:00 o'clock P. M., at the Council Chambers in the City Hall of Klamath Falls, Oregon, be fixed as the time and place for the hearing of objections and remonstrances against said proposed improvement; and the Police Judge be and he is hereby directed to cause notice of said hearing to be published as by Charter provided.

RESOLUTION

The City Engineer, pursuant to resolution of the Common Council heretofore adopted on June 15th, 1925, having filed plans, specifications and estimates of the cost of improving Washington street between 7th street and 8th street, including intersection at 7th street, and the council having taken same under advisement and finding said plans, specifications and estimates to be satisfactory.

IT IS THEREFORE HEREBY RESOLVED that said plans, specifications and estimates for the improvement of said portion of said street be and the same are hereby approved; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Common Council hereby declares its intention to improve said portion of said street in accordance with said plans, specifications and estimates. Said improvement shall consist of paving said portion of said street with rock base, or Warrentite bitulithic with bituminous concrete base, asphaltic concrete pavement, or asphaltic concrete pavement with rock base, at an estimated cost, including gutters, curbing, drainage, turnouts and sidewalks, of \$6,300.93, said improvement in either event to include grading, rolling, curbing and drainage, and said pavement in either event to be forty (40) feet wide, with concrete sidewalks five (5) feet wide on both sides thereof, with all parking strips leveled and rolled throughout.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Common Council hereby declares its intention to improve said portion of said street in accordance with said plans, specifications and estimates, to-wit: All of the northeasterly one-quarter of block 41; lots 5, 6, 7 and 8 of block 42, and lots 1, 2, 3 and 4 of block 53, all in Nichols Addition to Klamath Falls, Oregon; and lots 8, 9 and 10 of block 45, First Addition to the city of Klamath Falls, Oregon, and that said property above described be and the same hereby is declared to be benefited and assessed for the cost of said improvement; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Monday, the 20th day of July, 1925, at the hour of 8:00 o'clock P. M., at the Council Chambers in the City Hall of Klamath Falls, Oregon, be fixed as the time and place for the hearing of objections and remonstrances against said proposed improvement; and the Police Judge be and he is hereby directed to cause notice of said hearing to be published as by Charter provided.
