

SCORES OF TOURISTS, BOTH LOCAL AND FOREIGN, VISIT CRATER SUN.

Bears A Bit Haughty At First of Season; Few Tourists Brave Treacherous Trail Leading Down To Water From Rim

Scores of cars from the valley, Klamath Falls, northern California, and foreign cars thronged Crater lake national park Sunday, when it was officially opened for the first time in 1925.

With perfect roads, the snow cleared from all sections, and traffic well ordered, the day was ideal for the initial opening of the park.

At the entrance of the boundary of the camp, a new archway has been erected, made of seven huge logs, unbarbed. The top log lying across the others, is said to have been weighed at 7 tons.

A huge, shaggy black bear held full sway over government camp further on into the park, and tourists, visitors and cooks carried choice morsels to the bear, who snuffed scornfully at many of the dainties offered him. To one, unfamiliar with the trip, among the first things which strike the fancy, are the steep roofs of all the government buildings, reminiscent of the roofs of Russian homes, where the heavy snow weighs in the stouter of flat roofs.

Another bear, not so fat and sleek as the one at government camp, was sighted further into the park, grubbing under logs for food.

The road to the inn is cleared, and the last car carried up a red flag, to be returned by the last car leaving for the homeward stretch. This is done in order that no danger may be encountered on the road, which is extremely narrow at points. At several spots on the last mile and a half, snow touches both sides of the car.

Crater lake lodge served its first meal yesterday, scores of tourists, however, brought their lunch and picniced around the edge of the crater.

Due to the snow, which is treacherous around the rim, and down the trail to the water's edge, few tourists braved the trip down the path. However, the majority of the visitors took the Garfield trail hike and spent the major portion of the afternoon on the trail. At the peak of old Garfield, a long slide of snow, fully a block in length, stretched down to the rim of the crater, several hundred feet below. Oregon Alps, in miniature they appeared, and the hikers who reached the top, took the short cut down by sliding to the level below.
