CAUSE OF QUAKE TOLD BY PROFS.

BERKELEY, Calif., June 30.—(United News)—Scientists at the University of California believe that the Santa Barbara earthquakes will not be followed by similar earth movements in other sections of the Pacific coast. "Such a quake," said Professor Perry Byerly, university seismologist "usually relieves the strain on the earth's crust for a long time. There should therefore, be no alarm that the upheavals will be resumed immediately." Geologists attributed the temblors to local faulty fissures, not to the great San Andreas "fault" which runs the length of the Pacific coast and which caused the San Francisco earthquake of 1906.

A branch fault, traversing the mountains near Santa Barbara, is the one that probably "snapped" after an accumulated strain on the earth crust in that section had grown too great, it was explained.
