It more progress can be made by co-operation than by conflict.

"I want to see America as a leadership among the nations, the reliance upon the faith of mankind," the judge continued. "I believe how civilization can make permanent progress on the theory. If what is the productive peace is to be lost in the war of tomorrow, the people of this earth can forward to nothing but a servitude. There is no justification for hope. This was not the conception of Washington had on life. The people of the world are distrustful of each other, enter into mutual covenants, their mutual security, and covenants have been made, but they are solemnly observed, what the sacrifice. They are not the far more difficult of reparations, they are in the process of funding their debt to us, they can they not agree on permanent terms of peace and fully reliable international faith and order? If there be differences which cannot be adjusted at the moment, if there be conditions which cannot be foreseen, let them be solved in the future methods of arbitration and by the forms of judicial determination.

"While our own country should refrain from making political commitments where it does not have political interests, such covenants should have the moral support of our government and could not fail to have the commendation of the able opinion of the world. Such courts would be sure to endow participating nations with an abundant material and spiritual reward. On what other basis can we be any encouragement for a competition to attempt to finance a rival of European countries? No principle conforms to teaching of Washington, no other standard is worthy of the support of America."

CHICAGO GRAIN BROKERS CRASH

CHICAGO, July 3. — (United News) — The Dean, Onativa & Company brokerage house with liabilities estimated between 35,000,000 and 40,000,000 dollars failed in Chicago Friday, the most severe brokerage house crash in the history of the New York and Chicago stock exchanges.

The failure suggests the end of the \$26,000,000 Grain Marketing company organized several years ago as the most ambitious of the farmers cooperative marketing organizations. Despite the fact that plans are being discussed to continue the existence of this concern, it is reported that the cooperative feature has been definitely abandoned.

The grain company is not involved in the failure of Dean, Onativa & Company but has followed in some difficulties the brokerage house has been having. The brokerage house was closely connected with the affairs of the Rosenbaum Grain Corporation, one of the biggest companies that merged for lease and eventual sale of the grain marketing company.

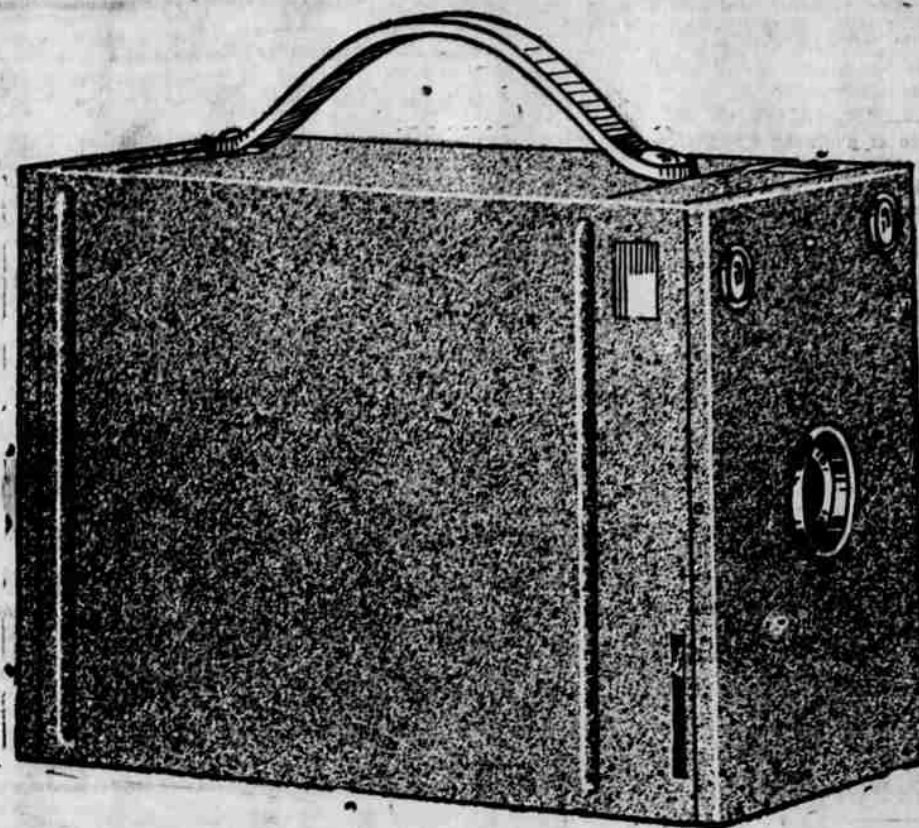
