BERLENBACH IS
CHASED OUT OF
RING, STALLING

DREAMLAND PARK, Newark, N. J., July 13.—(United News)—The championship bout between Paul Berlenbach, world's light heavyweight champion and Tony Marullo of New Orleans gave off such a strong odor of cheese as the two fighters floundered around the ring for more than eight rounds tonight that Referee Henry Lewis stopped the bout in the ninth on account of "stalling."

The crowd, which had been yelling for action all the way, and had even urged the fighters to be thrown out, loudly applauded the referee's action. This action also had the approval of State Boxing Commissioner Platt Adams of New Jersey, who in one of the earlier rounds asked Lewis to end it all if Berlenbach and Marullo did not put on more speed.

The bout was one of the most terrible exhibitions ever offered in a New York or New Jersey ring and some 15,000 fans were victimized.

Marullo injected a little vigor into it now and then, but Berlenbach as a champion, was a joke. It was a no-decision bout from the start, but the newspaper men gave Marullo the first four rounds and declared the next four even. The fight was stopped after 53 seconds of the ninth.

The fighters seemed to stumble more often than they landed any blows and no damage was inflicted by either. The referee warned them repeatedly that they were in the ring to fight with no success.
