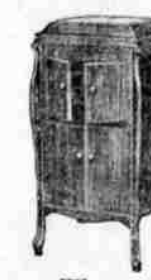
Hamilton Is—E. H. Hamilton, rancher of the Merrill road, where he owns a fine herd of dairy cattle, was among the out of town recent visitors.
