2 STORY BLDG. FOR NEWSPAPER

Melin Progress Building New Structure For Its Weekly

A two-story frame building will be the home of the new water users' and farmers' paper at Malin, according to Secretary A. M. Thomas, of the Klamath irrigation district.

The first story will be used as offices for the paper. The editor and his family will occupy the second floor as living quarters.

The linotype for the "Malin Progress" arrived in Malin from San Francisco yesterday, and the first issue of the paper will be published

as soon as the building is completed, the linotype installed, and the press transferred from the old plant.

The paper will not be merely a community paper for Malin, but will also cover all parts of the Klamath territory, dealing principally with problems of farmers, stockmen and water users. County correspondents will be signed up to furnish news from the outlying districts.

The first issue, according to Thomas, will appear early in August, although no definite date has yet been set for the inaugural publication. The paper will not be issued until all arrangements have been satisfactorily completed, and everything is in readiness for publishing a newspaper that will be the champion and the pride of Klamath water users.

Uncharted Cave In Lava Beds Explored

Howard And Mueller Probe Catacombs To Find Big Cave Enlarged

Final survey of the last uncharted cave in the Catacombs in the famous lava beds in Modoc county was made by J. D. Howard, who accompanied by Julius Mueller, spent an entire day in the Catacombs outlining and adding 144 feet to the total length of the last cave to be solved.

According to the "Explorers" in some sections of the cave it was necessary to crawl for 50 yards under 15 inch walls which for 50 feet in width would form shallow base of the cave. Again the cave would branch suddenly into immense pro-

portions and walking upright would be simple for some time.

Cool, sweet water was found in the cave which is said by Howard, who has made a study of the caves and especially the Catacombs, to be one of the most beautiful in the entire link of caverns. Colorings were especially gorgeous in the stalactites and pictures taken in the cave are expected to show some of the careless beauty as formed centuries ago.

According to Howard more than 1495 feet have been added to the cave length since last recorded dur-
