At The Hall—F. McArthur and E. T. Auble, cattlemen of the Alturas country are spending some time in the city and while here are shopping at the Hall hotel.

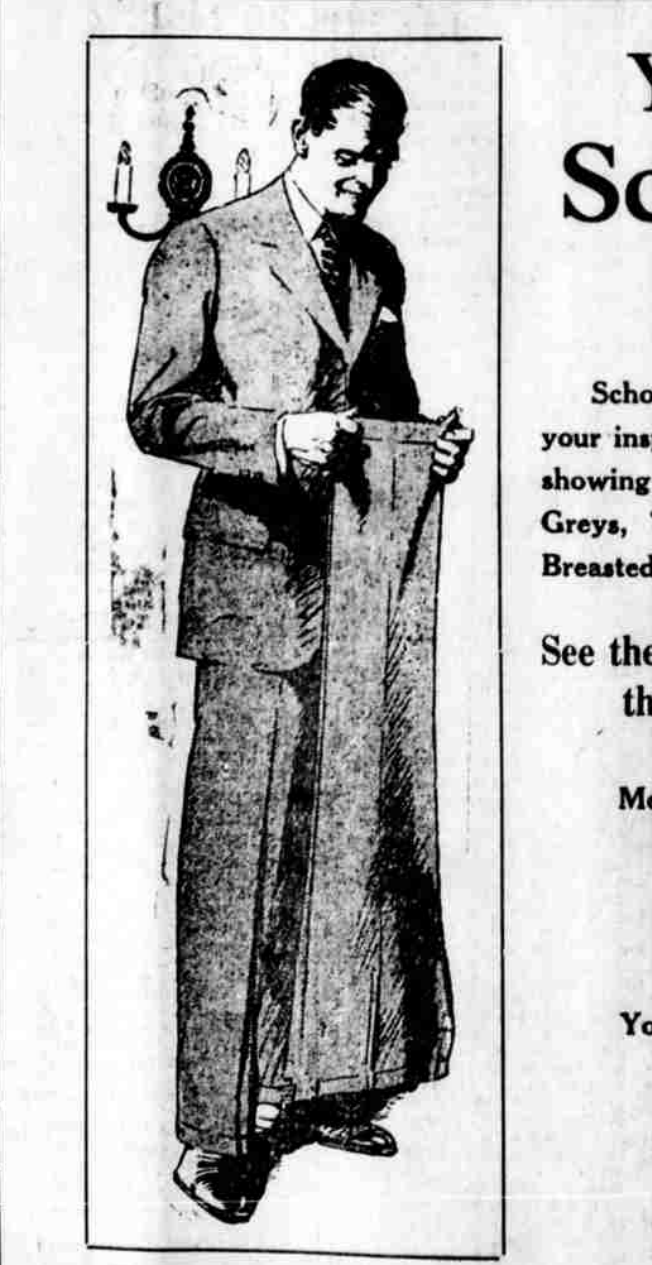
