WHEREAS, the Common Council of the city of Klamath Falls, Oregon, did by Ordinance Number 672, duly adopted on the 20th day of July, 1925, declare the proportionate assessment on each lot, part of lot, block, parcel and acreage property found to be benefited for a proportionate share of the cost of improving 5th Street from Pine Street northerly to Jefferson Street, all as more fully and in detail shown on the plans and specifications of the City Engineer on file with the Police Judge of said City in the matter of said improvement. 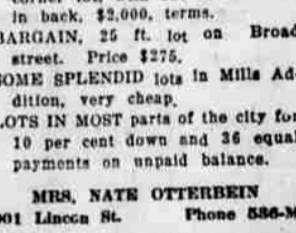

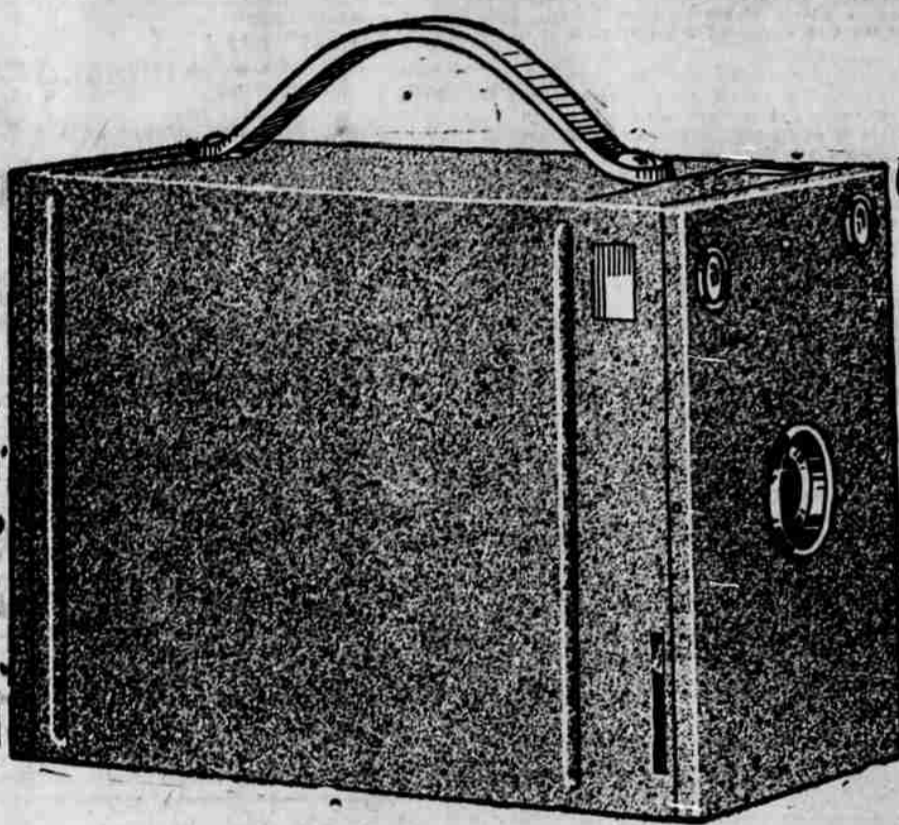
