

KLAMATH FARM KIDDIES MAKE HIT IN MOVIE

The motion picture story of the 1925 summer school at Corvallis for girl and boy farm club members, the first shots of which were fired in front of the Klamath county court house early in the morning of June 14, has been finished and turned over by the Southern Pacific company to Professor H. C. Seymour, state club leader, at Corvallis. It will be shown in Klamath Falls and at other places in this county at an early date, to be announced later by Professor Seymour.

The picture was made by the Southern Pacific company as part of its regular program of development as a gift to the leaders in farm club work. It will be used to show the people of Oregon what is being done to help the boys and girls and to make agriculture attractive as a career for men and women.

After a survey of farm club activity in all the territory served by the Southern Pacific, H. E. Kelly, the company's manager of development, decided that motion pictures offered the best medium for getting this work before the public. The picture was made by a member of Mr. Kelly's staff and a Southern Pacific cameraman.

Klamath county contributed the largest delegation to the summer school, and the first scene made shows Frank W. Sexton, county club agent, giving the Klamath delegation
