

JAZZ GIRL GOES ON TRIAL AGAIN

Ellingson Girl Nervous As Second Trial Opens For Mother Slaying

SAN FRANCISCO, Aug. 12.—(United News)—Hysterical along with an evident desire to end the case as quickly as possible, the prosecution has completed the preliminaries of its attempts to prove Dorothy Ellingson guilty of the murder of her mother.

Dorothy, her nervousness increasing steadily throughout the day, sat in a crowded court room Wednesday and heard witness after witness go over the details of the crime. She was pale and tired as she walked unsteadily from the room at the close of the session.

"Murder," "insanity," "jazzland" were words that visibly affected the 17-year-old girl who once had laughed recklessly at fate. She rocked to and fro in her chair, her fingers continuously twisting in her lap. But she is not expected to break into any of the wild hysteria that featured her previous trials; she seems too tired for that.

Morbid Court Crowd
A morbid crowd filled the room as the taking of evidence began before the jury of seven women and five men. There were gray haired men and women, as well as many of the youths with whom Dorothy had played in her old jazz-filled days, among the spectators.

Once, when a titter ran through the crowd as Dr. Shelby Strange, coroner's autopsy surgeon, was showing how it would have been impossible for Mrs. Anna Ellingson to have killed herself, Superior Judge Louderback threatened to clear the room.

"This is a serious trial, with murder and the fate of a defendant involved," he said. "Any repetition of this disturbance and the court will be cleared."

"Intentional Murder"
In his opening statement to the jury, Assistant District Attorney Harmon D. Skillin, in charge of the prosecution, said he expected to prove Dorothy "guilty of deliberate and intentional murder."

Alexander Mooslin, for the defense, countered with the promise that he would show the girl was a victim of pre-natal insanity.

"Her wild flings in jazzland, with its drinking and debauchery was the result of an utter lack of any sort of loins life," he said.

The young woman arrived from the Orient Wednesday on the liner President Pierce. During the June riots a ricksha bok carried her into a milling crowd of strikers. She was surrounded and threatened, and one of the students struck her with a sweater.

"How did you escape?" she was asked.

"I had a few healthy American screams and they ran away," she replied.

Breakfast: Blackberries, Toast, Coffee, Luncheon.
Salmon Salad, Mashed Potatoes, Bread Pudding, Iced Tea.
Dinner: Breaded Pork Chops, Stuffed Potatoes, Apple Sauce, Hot Biscuits, Chocolate Pudding, Coffee.
TODAY'S RECIPES
Salmon Salad—Keep a small can of salmon on ice until ready to use. Wash a small head of lettuce and place in cold water until luncheon time, and green onions. Drain the lettuce and arrange in little nests on large platter. Place salmon in center of each, cut and arrange the onions on salmon. Top with salad dressing and dust with paprika.
Stuffed Potatoes—Scrub large potatoes and bake one hour. Cut lengthwise, taking out the center carefully so as not to break the skins and put through a ricer. Add butter, salt, paprika, cream and milk with milk and paprika. Fill the shells with the mixture, making them high in the center. Sprinkle with grated cheese, dust with paprika and brown in oven while biscuits are cooking.
Breaded Pork Chops—Select large, thick chops. Beat one egg.

3000 FRENCH TROOPS DEFEATED BY RIFFS

PARIS, Aug. 12.—(United News)—Three thousand French troops have been defeated and compelled to retreat after a 24 hour battle with Druse tribesmen in Syria, a war office communique disclosed Wednesday night.

The column was dispatched under the command of General Michaud to relieve Suedia, where the Druses have surrounded a French garrison in the citadel. Near Mezraah Michaud's troops encountered the Druse army and were engaged all day and all night. Druse cavalry aid completed the rout of the French troops. The column's munitions, food and guns were captured by the Druses.
