

WHOLE STATE HUNTS FOR SLAYER OF PAIR FOR BETRAYING GUNMAN

INDIANAPOLIS, Ind., Aug. 15.—(United Press)—Displaying the cunning and daring that characterized the deceptions of Gerald Chapman, his companion in crime, on many thrilling forays, George "Dutch" Anderson, thief, gunman, bank robber and alleged "vengeance slayer," tonight eluded the web spun for him by thousands of law officers in scores of Indiana cities and towns.

Anderson is wanted for the murder of Ben Hance and his wife. The Hances were shot down on a road near Muncie late yesterday.

Police see in the double murder the deadly venom of Chapman, who awaits hanging in Connecticut for the murder of a policeman.

Anderson acted as executioner for Chapman, who, according to police, swore vengeance on Hance because he betrayed him to the police.

Charles "one-arm" Wolff sits in a cell in Muncie, stubbornly denying he knows anything about the crime. Police held he was Anderson's companion in the murder. Several persons insist that Wolff was in the vicinity of the murder an hour after the crime was committed.

Police believe that with just as much cunning as though they were being directed by Gerald Chapman, himself, former pals of the prince of crooks are carrying on a campaign of vengeance and banditry through the territory where Chapman once was active.

Near Muncie, Indiana, "Dutch" Anderson, Chapman's mentor in their prison days, later, is sought for the "revenge murder" of Mr. and Mrs. Ben Hance, who betrayed Chapman to the police.

At Steubenville, Ohio, a large garage is in fire rans because, police believe, its manager and a girl stenographer, in Chapman's Connecticut trial, identified him as the owner of an automobile which figured prominently in the murder of a policeman.

Operatives of the Ohio Bankers' association at Columbus, announced they believed Chapman's pals, probably led by "Dutch" Anderson, were responsible for two Ohio bank hold-ups yesterday at Dayton and Ohio City.

At Indianapolis, the Indiana Bankers' association hold the Anderson or Chapman gang responsible for the disappearance and possible murder of a detective who several weeks ago was "planted" with a gang of bank bandits, to get inside information of their activities.
