Here Are the Rules, Sportsem, Follow Them Strictly, and You'll Be All Right

By request from members of the Klamath Sportsmen's association The News herewith publishes the following laws governing the hunting of game animals and game birds in District No. 2.

The game laws have been rather indefinite in times past, owing to unpublished amendments, rulings of the game commission set aside in some instances and sustained in others and different interpretations by different authorities.

Particular attention is called to the changes made in some of the laws, such as in the open season for deer, which has been changed from September 1st to October 31st of last year, to September 15th to October 20th this year.

There is no open season in this district on Hungarian pheasants, and hunters are cautioned to be careful in their quail hunting not to shoot them. It is easy to distinguish this bird from the quail when it rises.

There shall be no open season on sage hens and prairie chickens in the state of Oregon until 1930.
