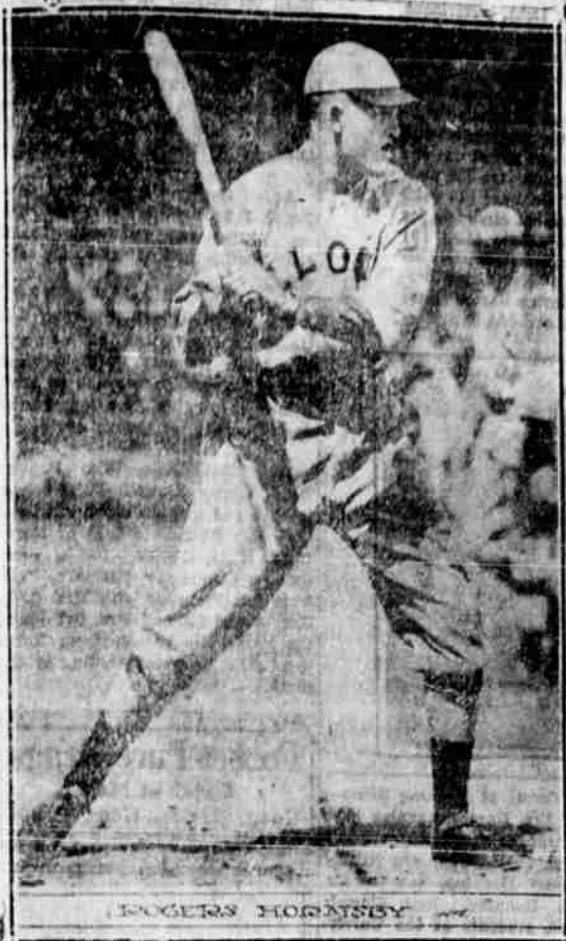


AFTER RUTH'S RECORD
