**U. S. SENATORS TO COME HERE**

Klamath Falls may play host to nine United States senators in the near future.

Such was the word received last night by Robert Kuykendall, member of a well-known legal firm, from Robert N. Stanfield, United States senator from Oregon.

The United States Senate public lands committee, of which Stanfield is chairman, in all probability will hold a public hearing in Klamath Falls on the grazing situation as it affects this territory, between September 1 and September 10, according to Mr. Kuykendall's information.

The meeting, it was said, will be of interest to virtually every person residing in Klamath county. Judge Gaghagen said yesterday that the Klamath county federal building committee of the chamber of commerce is prepared to present to the senate committee facts regarding the urgent need of a federal building for southeastern Oregon, to be located in Klamath Falls.

Persons pretending to be "in the know," declared that McNary and Stanfield are together in their

efforts to secure the building for this territory. The matter will be brought to their attention in the near future.
