BRITAIN IS FACING CHINESE BOYCOTT

NEW YORK, Aug. 22.—(United Press)—A nation-wide Chinese boycott on British trade which shipping interests in British Columbia fear will take place unless the British government can avert it would be the most serious commercial blow England could receive in the Orient next to the loss of India.

Advices to Victoria shippers, however, point out the weak spot in the newest effort of south China to drive British trade from the country.
