Klamath Federated Clubs Is Recognized

Ideas originating in Klamath county have a happy faculty for receiving good publicity and gaining state-wide attention.
 Such an example is the Stop Forest Fires campaign.
 But a more recent return is in the manner of the Klamath county Federated board, organized under the auspices of the Klamath county chamber of commerce early this spring, in which practically every community in Klamath county which has any sort of a community organization or county group is represented.
