

### Naval Officers Are Reluctant To Admit Fate Of Lost Plane

At any rate no flares were seen. The plane forced down when the last of her gasoline supply was used almost at the end of her attempted non-stop flight to Honolulu from San Francisco was believed carried far off her course and, if still withstanding the pounding force of the waves drifting rapidly to the southward.

Rear Admiral J. D. McDonald, Wednesday afternoon repeated his refusal to issue a statement on the probable fate of the flyers. Other officers maintain a hopefulness that a rescue will yet be effected.

As hours of darkness approached the men directing the search, remembering the fruitless efforts of the first night, redoubled their activities. The one encouraging factor was the clearing weather, which gave promise of greater visibility.

NAVAL HEADQUARTERS, SAN FRANCISCO, Sept. 2.—Flight of the PB-1 hydroplane from the mainland to Hawaii will not be undertaken tomorrow.

Captain Stanford E. Moses, flight project commander, announced at 4:05 p. m., that bad weather in the Pacific made postponement of the flight necessary.

Captain Moses said no tentative date for departure of the Boeing plane had been set.

"There will be a new weather forecast out about noon tomorrow and we will see then what the prospects are. Postponement will be from day to day, depending upon the weather," the commander said.

Postponement was announced immediately after the United States weather bureau here reported weather on the Pacific ocean would be very bad for a distance of 1200 miles from the mainland.

Captain Moses made no comment on reported opposition of Secretary of Navy Wilbur to the flight of the PB-1, and said he had no information as to whether bad weather would affect the search for the missing PN-9-1 plane.

### U. S. Willing To Make Chinese Concession

DETROIT, Mich., Sept. 2.—The United States is willing to give up her extra territorial rights in China as soon as that country demonstrates "that her laws and the administration of her judicial system are adequate for the protection of foreign lives and property within China." Secretary of State Kellogg declared in an address to the American Bar association here Wednesday night.

### Army Officer Gets Death Sentence For Slaying Society Girl

MANILLA, Sept. 2.—The death sentence pronounced upon Lieut. John S. Thompson, U. S. A. for the murder of Audrey Burleigh has aroused considerable controversy in army and civilian circles here.

The court martial trying the young officer for the slaying of the 18-year-old society girl, returned its verdict Wednesday. Well informed legal opinion, however, questions the legality of the sentence because military law specifically compels the defense council to submit all possible evidence favoring the defendant.

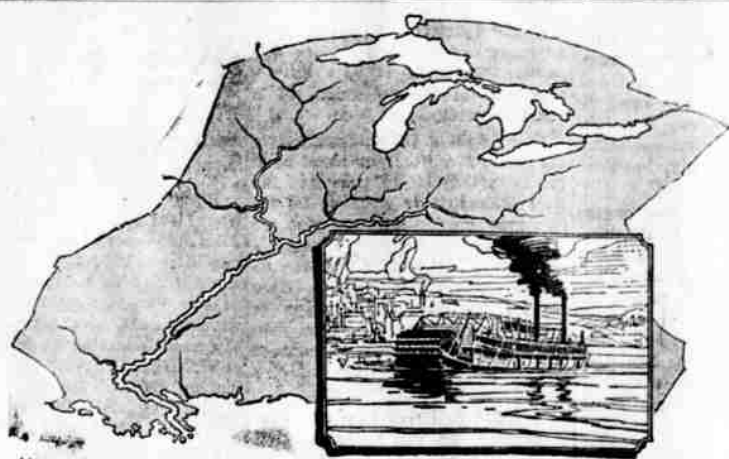
