

# Boxing Comes Back To Klamath With A Whale Of A Punch

## RITCHIE SCORES TECHNICAL K. O. OVER OLSON BY REAL COMEBACK; KID STARKEY GETS FLASHY WIN

Boxing came back to Klamath Falls last night in a whirlwind card that dazzled a two-thirds full house, but a card that was worthy of a 10,000 house in California hall, Oakland, for example. Boxing lagged last year in Klamath Falls. If promoters at the Scandinavian hall will continue to put up a monthly card of the calibre of last night's thriller, fans will be turned away for the lack of room.

Staging a wonderful comeback that was perceptible in his fight with Frankie Murphy here last July, Earl Ritchie, local heavy-weight tore into the favorite, Sammy Olson, gored him for eight rounds and emerged the winner by a technical knockout. The crowd was all with Olson at the outset, but Ritchie won them over by sheer ability on the defensive and remarkable punching power offensively.

In the first round Ritchie gave the fans a surprise by sidestepping blow after blow and making Olson swing wide a dozen times. Olson landed but one clean blow the entire round, and Ritchie had the round by a shade. Olson led the fight again in the second round, but Ritchie held his own and the round was even. In the third, Ritchie outwitted nearly every attempt of the Swede, who appeared in good condition, to measure him for a solid smash. The fight was on in real earnest in the fourth when Ritchie came out of the ring and dealt Olson a staggering blow to the chin. Olson staged a feeble comeback and Ritchie, while he hesitated to follow his first blow up finally succeeded in knocking him across the ring. Olson took three hard ones to the body before the bell saved him from further disgrace.

In the fifth and sixth the fight slowed up a bit but in the seventh it came back with all the fury of a cock fight. Ritchie tore into Olson, one hard sock to the ear, cutting a gash in that region. Olson fought back gamely but Ritchie was clearly the aggressor. Olson entered the ring with the gong sounding in the eighth, a tired man. Ritchie delivered four clean blows in succession to the head, without a return. Olson's seconds threw the towel in the ring and Ritchie was the winner.

For speed and action, however, the semi-windup made the hit of the evening with the fans. Kid Starkey's powerful right hook was there with all its punch. Duke Evans, although he outweighed Starkey 10 pounds, was simply outclassed. But he put up one of the gamest losing man's fights ever seen here with the possible exception of Joe Coffman, who fought here last year. Starkey took every round of the fight as long as it lasted which was 4 1/2 out of a scheduled six. In the third the bell saved Evans after he went down three times in succession for the count of nine. He stood up under a terrific bombardment for two minutes in the fourth until he was

so plainly whipped his seconds were ragged him out. The preliminaries were a fitting prologue. Chuck Sands, outweighed 15 pounds, got a decision from Stanley Morris. Babe Lightfoot and Kid Exell went; four rounds with a decision to the Babe.

## IT'S WASHINGTON AND PITTSBURGH IN WORLD SERIES

NEW YORK, Sept. 5.—Pittsburgh and Washington stepped out today as almost certain winners of the major league pennant and rivals in the world series.

Bucky Harris and his charging Washington Senators won their seventh successive victory when they outgamed the Boston Red Sox, 7 to 6, and increased their lead over the Philadelphia Athletics to seven full games in the American league pennant race.

**7 In Row For Senators**  
While the Senators were enjoying a winning streak the Athletics now almost a forlorn hope, couldn't get out of their losing habit and they were shut out by the Ruthless New York Yankees.

The defeat of the Athletics was the ninth they had suffered in succession and the 11th in their last 16 games.

The Senators, moving along on high speed with "robber" pitchers helping reliable old veterans, have almost as much of an advantage over their nearest rivals as the Pirates, who are leading the New York Giants in the National league by eight games.

**Crucial Series To Start**  
The Senators open a four-game series against the Athletics in Philadelphia on Monday. Even if the Athletics should sweep the series with four victories, the Senators would not be in a precarious position because they would leave Philadelphia with a three games lead and the Senators have the easier road to the finish.

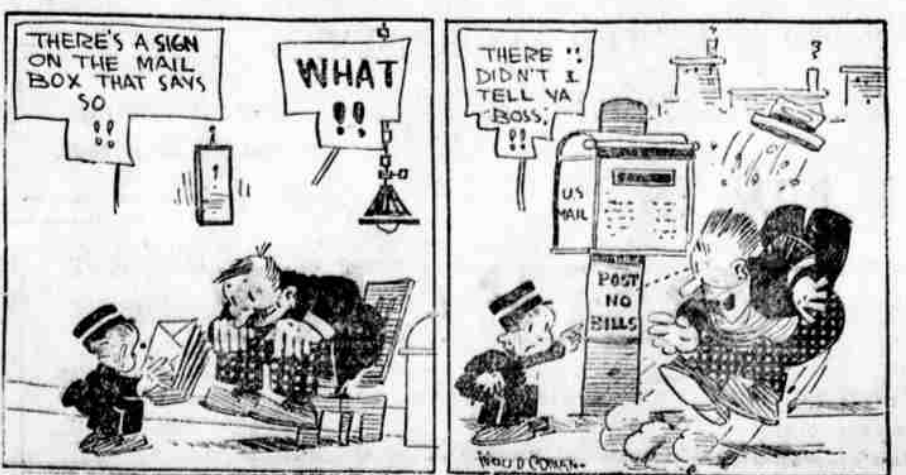
