W. C. T. U. LEADER IS FOULY SLAIN BY BOOTLEG RING

VINTON, Iowa, Sept. 9.—Vowing a bitter campaign of retaliation which will drive every bootlegger from the state, members of the Women's Christian Temperance Union are mourning the death of their militant leader, Mrs. C. B. Cook, believed to have been assassinated by a bootlegger.

Mrs. Cook died Tuesday from the effects of a bullet wound near the heart. She had been shot by an unidentified assailant as she sat near a window in her home. The cold-blooded killing climaxed a week's campaign against booze suspects in which she is said to have participated.

Her testimony in several cases had helped convict bootleggers, and there were few persons hated more by the illicit booze vendors of Benton county, where Mrs. Cook was president of the county chapter.

Shot While Writing Authorities declare their conviction that the killing was the revenge of a bootlegger or possibly of a bootlegging clique. The members of the W. C. T. U. hold the same view, and Miss Minnie Usher, secretary of the county organization, has pledged her order to renewed strife against the rum gangs.

"This is not the end of the W. C. T. U. in Iowa," sobbed Mrs. S. W. Cook, mother-in-law of the victim. "We are going to hold the torch still higher. This murder, the shooting down of a God-fearing woman in her home, only rouses us to new efforts to crush the illicit liquor trade in this community."

Mrs. Cook's home was near the railroad tracks and near a rendezvous for rum runners and bootleg peddlers. Once, during her fight to drive out the alcohol traffic, a gang of men defaced the house with a barrage of rotten eggs. Lecturing, writing pamphlets and doing sleuthing of her own, she maintained an ever vigilant war against the rum clan.

Is Found Dying She was seated near an open window late Monday night preparing a paper to be read at the county convention of the W. C. T. U. when the shooting occurred. The shade had been drawn to within three inches of the window sill, but persons standing in the darkness outside could have seen the woman distinctly, authorities say. The shot apparently had been aimed with deadly accuracy.

Suddenly there was the roar of a shot and a simultaneous tinkle of glass. The bullet had crashed through the window. Mrs. Cook's mother, Mrs. E. Underwood, rushed into the room to find her daughter lying on the floor, screaming. Then the victim lapsed into unconsciousness and died without speaking. The bullet had passed through her left arm before piercing her breast.

Kept Vinton Clean Mrs. Cook won the title of "Iowa's Carrie Nation" through her ardent labor for the temperance cause. Under her leadership Vinton had been virtually rid of bootleggers. The last clean-up was so effective that Sheriff Whitefield Ruhl announced several days ago Vinton was "dry as the Sahara," and offered a \$25 reward out of his own pocket to anyone who could purchase liquor in the city. Ruhl is now leading the forces scouring the countryside for trace of the murderer, but no clues have been obtained as yet.
