CHICAGO, Sept. 10.—The state has asked that a hanging verdict be returned in the trial of Jack Wilson and Joseph Holmes, two of the five men who staged a wild west hold-up in the exclusive Drake hotel here several weeks ago in which a cashier was shot and killed.

George E. Gorman, first assistant state's attorney made his opening statement to the jury Thursday and described the crime, as "the most revolting in the history of the city."

Two of the bandits were shot and killed in the hold-up and one escaped with \$10,000.
