## Large Increase in Merrill Schools Is Reported This Year

The increase in the Merrill grade schools this year over last year is more than ten per cent, necessitating the employment of a fifth teacher. The high school enrollment is slightly over what it was at the same time last year, with several more students yet to enroll.

Despite this increase in both the grades and high school, Lester Turnbaugh, superintendent of the Merrill schools, reports that the school is better equipped for the best type of school work than it has been for years. Due to the fact that three new classrooms were made out of the old gymnasium, all the grades are now on the same floor, facilitating intercourse among the grades and making supervision and mutual help among the teachers more feasible.

Since the high school has all of the third floor for its own use a new science room has been arranged, tables are being installed, and with the new equipment of last year is in excellent condition, the school is much better equipped for the teaching of science. The old science room is now being used as a commercial room. Sixteen of the 46 students now enrolled are taking typing. The English room is

now used as a library and reading room. More research assignments are now being given to the students due to the increased opportunity the library room affords for this project work.

New blackboards are being installed in the grade rooms over the week-end, and the new furnace will be ready for use by Tuesday, September 15. A telephone is being installed for the first time. A significant fact in the growth of the Merrill high school is seen in that 19 of the 46 students enrolled are freshmen.

Strict rules for sanitation and health should be enforced for the general good of the community and greater co-operation should be had between the various departments to the end that this city should be an ideal community in which to reside.

In conclusion, I would say that if elected, I will work for a bigger and better Klamath Falls.

## BOYS AND GIRLS CLUBS TO SHOW SEASON'S WORK

The arts of sewing, baking and canning, as taught to children enrolled in club work, will be demonstrated to visitors who attend the coming Jackson County Industrial Fair, Medford, September 16 to 19. Exhibits by the children will be prominently featured by the fair management. Not only will they exhibit in the household arts, but in livestock events and garden contests as well.

As a result of instruction by club leaders, fair visitors will learn that many boys have become proficient in baking and sewing, while many

girls are excelling the livestock field.

Mrs. S. H. Carter, in charge of children's activities at the fair, says the exhibits of boys and girls will prove a surprise to all visitors. Many loaves of bread baked by children, will be shown in the baking exhibits. The old practice of using a pinch of this and a dash of that, is not followed by the children receiving baking instructions. Every loaf of bread made by them will be made from exact rule. They measure every ounce of flour, salt and other ingredients used in making bread, leaving nothing to guesswork or the eye.

Instructions in sewing and canning is just as thorough. Many fine exhibits of needlecraft, exemplifying the common sense principles of sewing, as taught by sewing club leaders, will be shown.

Visitors will be greatly impressed by the neatness and thoroughness with which the children have done their work. All canned fruits, vegetables or meats shown will be by the cold-pack method.
