### If Children Ail Keep Them Out of School—Newsome

Does your child appear to suffer from any illness?

Does he seem to have anything as apparently trivial as a "cold in the head?"

If he has, it would be best to keep him from school, according to Dr. G. S. Newsome, director of the county health unit. And by that, Dr. Newsome does not mean that the average child, whom you might suspect as having a disease, should be kept from school. For the teachers, Dr. Newsome says, will weed a sick boy or girl out from the others more quickly than would the average person.

"Anything which keeps children in school saves their time and the taxpayers' money," Dr. Newsome said yesterday. "A good deal can be done to hold down the spread of catching diseases if certain precautions are observed. First of all, it does no good to allow a child to remain in school until its disease is well developed. Almost all of the common contagious diseases are at least as catching in the early stages, before they are recognized, as they are later on. It therefore is necessary to keep on guard, and to pick up suspicious symptoms."

When measles exist, he explained, children should be watched for colds in the head. Similarly, if scarlet fever or diphtheria are prevalent, every child who has a sore throat should be excused from school.

Keeping children with suspicious symptoms out of school will do more to prevent the spread of diseases than all fumigation and quarantining of children who already have developed the disease, Dr. Newsome said.
