

LIQUOR SCANDAL IN CHICAGO IS BEING PROBED

CHICAGO, Sept. 17.—(United News)—The United States government has taken a hand in Chicago's latest liquor scandal, and events moved rapidly in federal court as authorities Wednesday endeavored to learn why Terry Druggan, wealthy bootlegger obtained lengthy leaves of absence from the county jail, and why Frankie Lake, his partner in the beer trade was released from prison 22 days before his term expired.

At the end of the day Sheriff Peter Hoffman and six other employees of the county jail were cited by Federal Judge James Wilkinson to show cause why they should not be held in contempt of court. Lake, debonaire beer runner and wholesaler, was recommitted to the county jail to serve the balance of his term.

MITCHELL WILL BE CALLED INTO AERIAL HEARING

WASHINGTON, D. C., Sept. 17.—(United News)—Sitting behind closed doors in the cabinet room at the white house, adjoining the president's office, the special aircraft board appointed by Coolidge, mapped out its preliminary program Thursday for the investigation, the results of which will have a strong influence upon the government's future policy regarding aviation.

The investigation probably will get under way next Monday at the capitol, it was announced after the meeting the same date set for beginning of the inquiry into the Shenandoah disaster at Lakehurst, N. J. The board will hold another session Friday to further complete its plans. It merely laid the ground work Thursday.

Col. William Mitchell, who precipitated the investigation by his sensational charges, will be called before the board, it was announced by Dwight W. Morrow, who was chosen chairman. It was learned that Mitchell probably would appear about a week after the inquiry begins. He will be given full opportunity to present all the evidence he desires regarding his charges of maladministration of aviation by the war and navy departments.

"The board plans to hear first, the representatives of the air services of the army, navy and the post-office as to their present condition, organization, equipment, condition and the relation of the services to each other," a statement by the board said.

"The board expects thereafter to invite numerous witnesses, including Col. Mitchell to appear before them with criticisms and constructive suggestions."

The sessions of the board will be open. They will be held in the room of the house interstate and foreign commerce committee.

WEYERHAESERS GIVEN 50 MILE R. R. EXTENSION

PORTLAND, Sept. 17.—Plans have virtually been completed for joint construction of a 50 mile railroad line into the Clearwater timber district in northern Idaho by the Northern Pacific and O. W. R. & N., according to J. P. O'Brien, general manager of the O. W. R. & N. The extension is to be made in connection with the Weyerhaeuser development in the Lewiston area. The new line is to be run northeasterly from Orofino on the Northern Pacific Stites branch and up the Clearwater river.

On completion of the line it will be placed under the supervision of the Camas Valley railroad along with the Stites branch and through this system logs will be hauled from the Clearwater area to Lewiston for milling.
