NOTICE OF PROPOSED ASSESSMENT ROLL, IMPROVEMENT UNIT No. 43, BEING A RESOLUTION

FIXING THE TIME AND PLACE FOR THE HEARING OF OBJECTIONS TO THE PROPOSED ASSESSMENT ROLL MADE AND FILED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL IN THE MATTER OF THE IMPROVEMENT OF WASHINGTON STREET FROM SEVENTH TO EIGHTH STREETS INCLUDING THE INTERSECTION AT SEVENTH STREET, SAME BEING KNOWN AS IMPROVEMENT UNIT No. 43, AND APPROVING THE ASSESSMENT ROLL HERETOFORE FILED HEREIN.

WHEREAS the Common Council has made and filed in the office of the Police Judge the PROPOSED ASSESSMENT ROLL in connection with the proposed improvement of Washington Street from Seventh to Eighth Street, including the intersection at Seventh Street, as more fully shown on the plans and described in the specifications of the City Engineer on file in the matter of the said improvement with the said Police Judge.
