ELECTRIC SIGNS WILL ADVERTISE KLAMATH COUNTY

Klamath county will be better
advertised than ever before at the state
fair in Salem next week. Designed
by, and at the expense of the local
chamber of commerce a huge electri-
cally illuminated booth will set off
the big display of Klamath products.

The electrical display was designed
by Lin Sabie, secretary of the local
chamber. In the background is a
rising sun, its rays penetrating over
the entire booth. Just in front of
this rising sun is the inscription
"Klamath county, an empire awak-
ing." Colored lights add an ef-
fectiveness and novelty to the dis-
play. Pine trees which look real
will be part of fore display section,
the sun shining through them in the
background.

Potatoes will be the ace card of
Klamath county for prize honors.
Last year this county took first,
third, fourth and fifth in that pro-
duct, leaving only second place to
one other county in the state.

Two big booths will house the
products collected by County Agent
Henderson. The chief products to
be exhibited will be Klamath county
sugar beets, lettuce, potatoes, alf-
alfa, hay, grain and a number of
vegetables.

Mystery of the Sea Involved in Finding of Dead Sailor Man

SAN PEDRO, Calif., Sept. 23.—
(United News)—A gruesome token
of a deep sea mystery—the body
of a sailor strapped to a keg and
found floating 30 miles off Los
Angeles harbor, remained unsolv-
ed Wednesday after a grim pro-
cession of old tars failed to recog-
nize the body.

The keg and body, badly decom-
posed, was found bobbing on rough
Pacific waters Tuesday by fisher-
man and brought into the har-
bor for identification.

One leg and one arm were tight-
ly strapped to the cask, indicating,
officers say, that the man was
thrown overboard alive.

family residence.

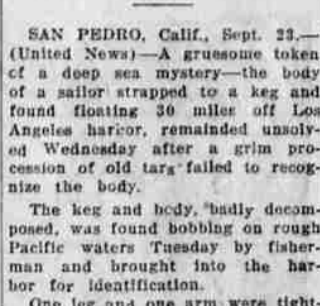
Mrs. Richard Ely Danielson, of

with the house of Hohenzollern.

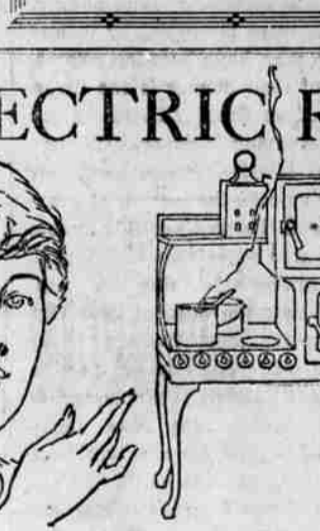
She was married to Prince Philip
