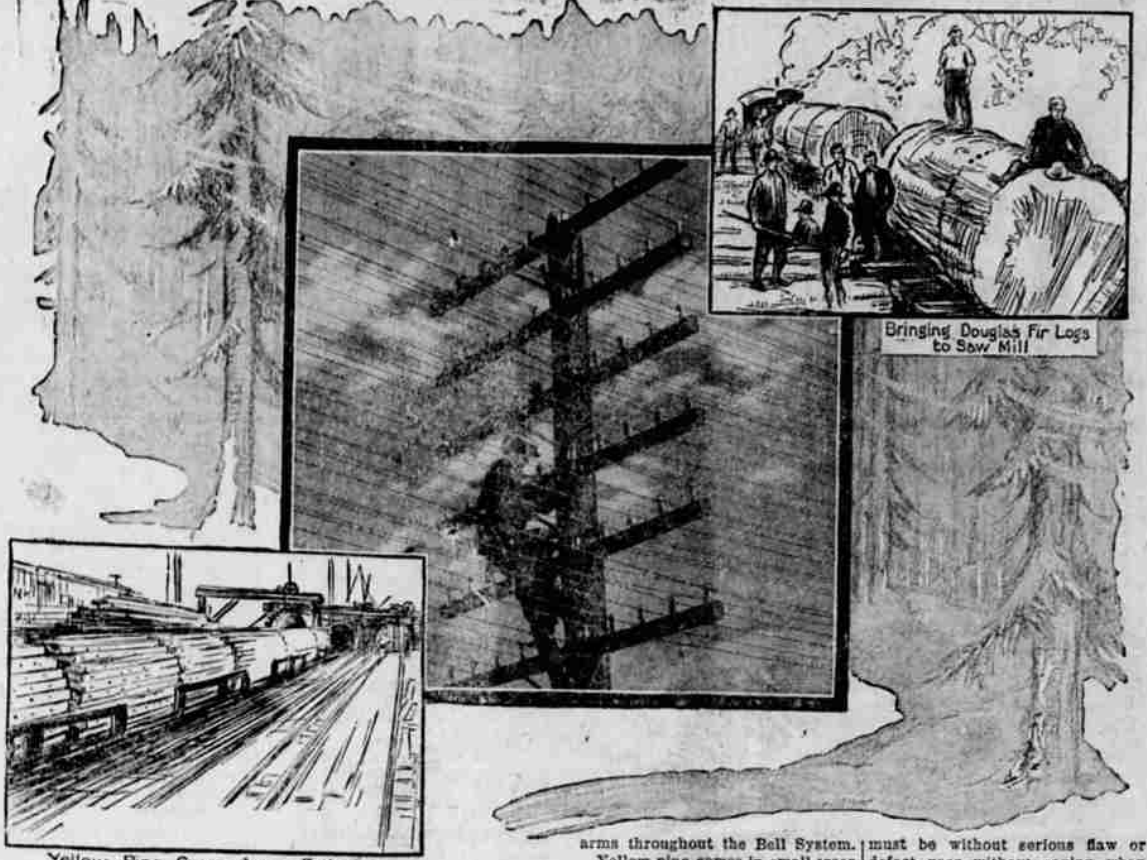

Commonplace Crossarm Plays Important Role in Dramatic Story of America's Telephone Service



Yellow Pine Cross Arms Entering The Creosoting Cylinders

By R. T. BARRETT NOTHING is much more commonplace than a telephone crossarm.

The seeker for romance would scarcely hope to find it in a plain, unadorned stick of timber...

And yet, if a crossarm could talk, it could tell a tale not altogether devoid of drama...

But there is romance, surely, in helping to speed a nation's spoken words in the transmission of America's telephone talk...

The simple truth is that without the crossarm America's far-flung network of telephone wires would have been well nigh impossible.

HOOVER OUTLINES AVIATION BUREAU

WASHINGTON, Sept. 23.—(United Press)—Commercial aviation had its day before the president's aircraft board Wednesday.

Secretary of Commerce Hoover, who followed Postmaster General New and other postoffice officials on the stand, laid out a definite program of government help...

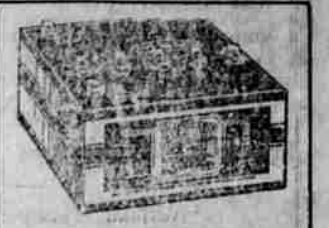
1—Establishment of an aviation bureau in his department to carry out necessary regulation. 2—Contracting the transportation of mails by private concerns.

3—Establishment of air ports at important cities, which should be done by the municipalities themselves.

"I believe with this minimum extension of governmental activity, we can secure a commercial aviation in the United States without subsidy," Hoover declared.
