TIME AT CONFERENCE**

the war being waged by the French
in Morocco.

The telegram, which was made
public here Thursday, described war
on the mountain folk of Morocco as
"nothing short of barbarism."

"Caillaux, French finance minis-
ter, landed in America seeking exten-
sion of time payment of the
French debt due America, and re-
duction of interest thereon," the
governor's telegram read. "A few
days ago press dispatches carried the
news that France had sent a fleet
of 16 airships to fight the Rifians
in Morocco, and France boasted that
each airship dropped two tons of
high explosives upon the homes of

the Moroccans, killing defenseless
men, women and children."
