"I am ready to admit that the vicissitudes of the Pirates should be a fine year for baseball," he said. "I'm for the National league has such a great winner."

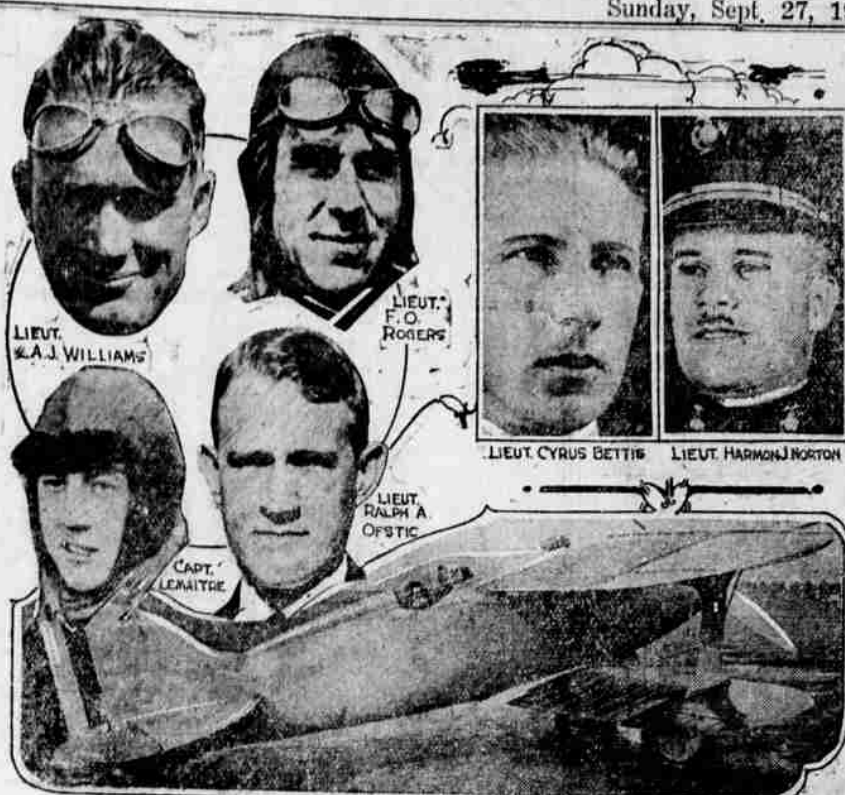

McGraw READY FOR DEBT BATTLE

WASHINGTON, Sept. 25.—(United Press)—Senator William E. Borah, apparently is preparing for a fight against ratification of a funding agreement for the national debt which does not compel the government to pay on the terms agreed by the British.

Borah believes that if the French commission agrees to fund the debt it will immediately begin negotiations to make a private loan in the street. His attack probably will be launched against the agreement whereby creditors pay the national debt at small interest rates and then cheerfully to pay interest charges twice as large for sums obtained from the same sources.

Borah has written a letter to Secretary of the Treasury Mellon, Friday, Borah asking for information on "private loans which have been negotiated with foreign countries and industries during the year to the amount of \$1,000,000,000."

"May I ask whether your department has accurate information as to these loans, both as to which have been made and to which are now in process? I would greatly appreciate a list of the loans, by whom negotiated, the countries making the loans, and particularly the rate of interest they bear, and such other information or facts as may be helpful in closing the terms in dealing with the different transactions."
