long time loans to farmers, admittedly a system of great advantage to the stockman and grower.

Among chief matters of importance to be dealt with is initial work of organizing the incorporation of an agricultural credit association among the farmers of Klamath. This undertaking hopes to aid the farmer with loans of from nine months to three years which would obviate the necessity of the farmer liquidating his stock under short-time loan handicaps. Such loans would also include farm produce, with an interest plan which would never necessitate the principal becoming due at any given time, short of that affixed by arrangement. This, say farmers, eliminates loans made on each year's crop, becoming due on harvest and gives the grower a chance to develop and get back on his feet unhandicapped by heavy short-time payments.

Saturday at 2:30 p. m., an informal reception will be held for Mr. Jewett and party at the chamber of commerce rooms at Klamath Falls, Oregon, at which Mr. Jewett will also make an address.

All members of the several federal farm loan associations in this county, their wives, families and friends, and, in fact, any one interested in the welfare of agricultural and livestock industries in Klamath county, are cordially invited to be present and meet Mr. Jewett at either or both of these meetings, and to ask any and all questions upon which they desire reliable information about this system of farm loans.

for construction of Modoc Northern, under rules of practice there is not sufficient time to file application and supporting data before hearing October 5. Manifestly any report to bring Modoc Northern case before I. C. C. would meet with objection which would probably be sustained by I. C. C. on the grounds that it would introduce new issues. While commission is not opposed to construction of Modoc Northern it is opposed to accepting Modoc Northern as substitute for direct trans-state line which it believes to be of utmost importance to the development of the entire state. It is our firm belief that both Modoc Northern and trans-state line will be constructed. Commission must take broader view and consider the need of entire state. May we direct attention to fact that Modoc Northern which you state is most important line in Oregon would be constructed in California while our application is for railroads in Oregon. Modoc Northern would shorten present distance to eastern markets from Klamath Falls. Trans-state line Odell to Crane will shorten distance from Klamath Falls to all points east of Granger 57 miles under mileage of Modoc Northern cross state line would shorten distance 227 miles
