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SCOUT HEADLINES IN CITY BOYS PROGRAM

Cook, scout executive for Klamath Falls, has arrived in Klamath Falls to spend the remainder of the week, arranging for the scout activities of the boy scout group in the city.

According to Cook, a meeting will be called this week of the local council to make future plans for reorganization. The local council was organized last month when conditions were declared not satisfactory with the other two counties.

Cook recently returned from the regional scout executive convention and training school in Spokane held from September 15 to September 19, inclusive. More than 45 representative executives were present from Washington, Idaho, Oregon and Montana. No definite action was taken during the meeting in regard to the dissolution of the three southern counties, according to Cook, who maintains that the matter will be decided locally.

Hours of daily conference are being put in by all executives who attended the convention. George Fisher of New York City, national headquarters attended all the meetings and spoke on several different occasions. An interesting visitor at the convention was Captain George Mills, safety first and life saving man who gave new ideas on water proof safety, life saving methods and other tips which will be used at all scout camps during the coming summers.

According to Cook, a new troop will be organized on Friday afternoon in the Sacred Heart academy, under the supervision of A. Merino and John Crawford. It is expected that more than 20 boys will enroll in the troop.

There are at present 45 troop members in the city, according to the scout executive and before the week is over it is anticipated that there will sign the scout pledge. Sixty three troops will be formed in three days from school boys.

Irrigation season on the Klamath project is officially closed, according to announcement received yesterday in the city. Head gates at the source of the main canal were shut on Monday morning and the officials of the reclamation office have proclaimed the season at an end. If Klamath county has as much spring water as it had this past year it is probable that the season for opening the head gates will be early in the spring of 1926, and the opening depends largely on the amount of spring water from the rains and melting of winter snows.
