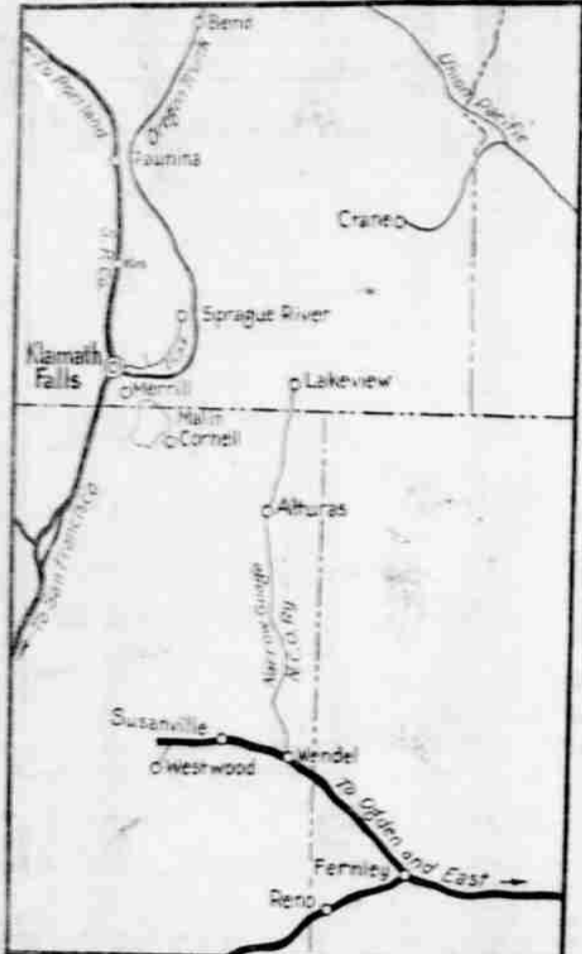


Maps Showing Program of Southern Pacific, Against Those of Oregon Trunk and O. P. S. Commission Plans



The above maps show proposed and possible extensions of the three big railroad projects that will make Oregon and Klamath rail history. They will be on these extensions that the rail battle, which opens its second round Monday, will be centered around.

To the left is the Southern Pacific program. It offers:

- 1—Shortest main line east via the Lake and Nevada, California and Oregon railroads. It was the first to be authorized by Congress.
- 2—Feeder lines centered around Klamath Falls.
- 3—Terminal with \$1,200,000 estimated payroll at Klamath Falls.
- 4—Construction program of \$26,000,000.
- 5—In the center is the Oregon Trunk program. It includes:
 - 1—Extension from Bend to Klamath Falls.
 - 2—Construction costs about \$7,000,000.
 - 3—Construction money draining into Bend.
- 6—On the right is the Oregon public service commission's outline. It consists of the Crater-Oak Hill cross-state line. By it the Klamath and Modoc country would pass out of the railroad picture.

Tommy Milligan Is Held Coming Welton

NEW YORK, Oct. 1.—(Special News)—Tommy Milligan, the British middleweight fighter, who was held in his first fight on American ground, probably will be admitted to the select group of welterweights and middleweights, who will meet in the new Madison Square Garden this winter. Tom Hickok, forecasting a death of good matches among the bantams, featherweights and lightweights, intends to feature fighters between 147 and 160 pounds. This squad includes Harry Greb, Dave Shade, Jack Zivic, Sam Freedman and probably Milligan.

Milligan signed his own recommendation when he beat Schaller, who is highly respected, and widely avoided as a dangerous puncher.
