

SPRAGUE IS HELD LIABLE ON HEAVY FINANCIAL NOTE

Signature Adjudge That of Endorsor for \$100,000 to Soap King

CHICAGO, Oct. 2.—(United News)—The name of Col. A. A. Sprague, signed on the back of a note for \$100,000, was that of an endorser which makes him liable with William C. Proctor, Cincinnati soap king for the total amount on the face.

This was the verdict of a jury returned in Judge Thomas Slick's federal court room Friday afternoon in Proctor's suit to collect half the amount of the note from Sprague. The note was used to float a loan to finance Maj. Gen. Leonard Wood's presidential campaign in 1920. The amount mentioned in the verdict was \$42,637. This represents half of the original amount of the note plus interest at five per cent.

The verdict came after the jury had labored all night. Early Thursday night when it became apparent no immediate verdict was in sight, the jury was ordered to return a sealed verdict Friday morning. When court opened no decision had been arrived at and it was not until late in the afternoon that a verdict was reached.

Proctor was the financial director of the Wood presidential campaign. In the final effort to land Wood in the white house he sought a loan of \$100,000. His name was signed on the back as principal, while Sprague's name appeared also. Proctor contended Sprague signed as endorser, while the defense plea was that Sprague signed his name merely as a check for the bank, of which he was a director.

Immediately following return of the verdict attorneys for Sprague made a motion for a new trial, but Judge Slick said his docket was so crowded he did not know when he could hear arguments.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 1.—American and French negotiators have concluded a temporary arrangement for payments on the French debt to the United States.

Joseph Gaillaux, French minister of finance, will sail for Paris Friday night bearing a proposal for payment of 600 million annually during the next five years, pending resumption of negotiations to land the debt. 
