The Oregon Public Service commission is favoring the Union Pacific line in preference to that of the S. P.-Modoc Northern project.

The only opposition the Northern lines are expecting to inject into the Modoc Northern application is a request for common use on that road, providing the Northern lines are given permission to come to Klamath Falls.
