

WHITE HOUSE SET BOASTS NEW LADY

WASHINGTON, Oct. 12.—(United News)—Now there's another good looking Mrs. Davis in the white house social set.

Mrs. Dwight F. Davis, wife of the new secretary of war, brings to the cabinet a reputation for smart dressing, good looks and for having "belonged" socially all her life. She is the second Mrs. Davis among the cabinet ladies. Mrs. James J. Davis, wife of the secretary of labor, is the other. Both are young and good looking, and each has four children. Mrs. James J. Davis is the younger.

Except for ill-health, this newest cabinet lady might prove the social leader of the white house set. She has been in Washington four years, having come here first as the wife of the war finance corporation director, when her husband was given that position by President Harding. During the first two years the Davises were very active socially, and Mrs. Davis was noted for her good looks, beautiful clothes and social distinction. Then she had a serious illness and since has lived almost in social retirement.

Last spring Mrs. Davis went to France for special treatment, spending three months there. She has been recovering slowly, and is now much improved. She probably will be able to do her share of official entertaining this winter.

Aldridge had only one day's rest after his successful work of Monday in Washington, so the extra day is sure to benefit him even more than it will benefit Johnson, who pitched his last victory Sunday.
