May Have Been Philosopher, But Pays His Fine

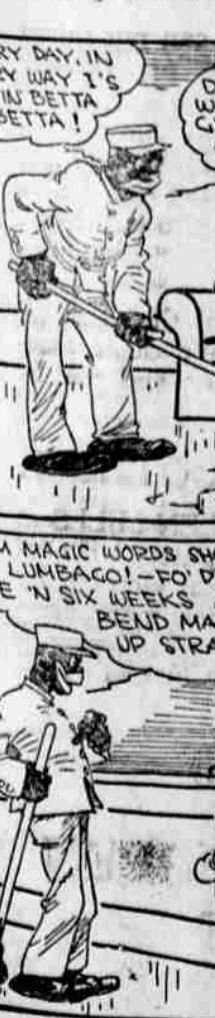
