Observance of League Pact Brings Tragedy

Almost following immediately on the heels of peace treaties, subsequent to termination of the World war, comes news that a Bulgarian town is burning as a result of an artillery bombardment from neighboring troops of Greece.

Bulgaria was one of the countries entering the conference of diplomats having to do with those same peace treaties. Bulgaria's plaint now is that by reason of her military forces being disarmed by the peace pacts, she is not able to defend herself against armed aggression from across the border.

In complying with the terms of the treaty and disarming, Bulgaria looked for protection in time of stress from the allied powers, party to the same covenants. Instead she got shells from enemy artillery.

While it is true that the league of nations claims to have warded off another Balkan war, and that the council has been summoned to meet in Paris to arrange settlements, the fact still remains that four days of bloodshed, death and destruction raged along the Macedonian frontier before effective pressure could be brought to bear to stop it.

The league may pride itself on the fact that cessation of hostilities came about before a formal declaration of war was given birth, but stopping the warring faction cannot give back the lives of victims, nor allay the grief and suffering of surviving relatives.

Whatever the grievance which caused the outbreak may be, or which country was right, and which wrong, seems insignificant alongside of the obvious conclusion that something in the league's control seems to lack the power to stop artillerymen from pulling the firing string, if they feel like doing so.

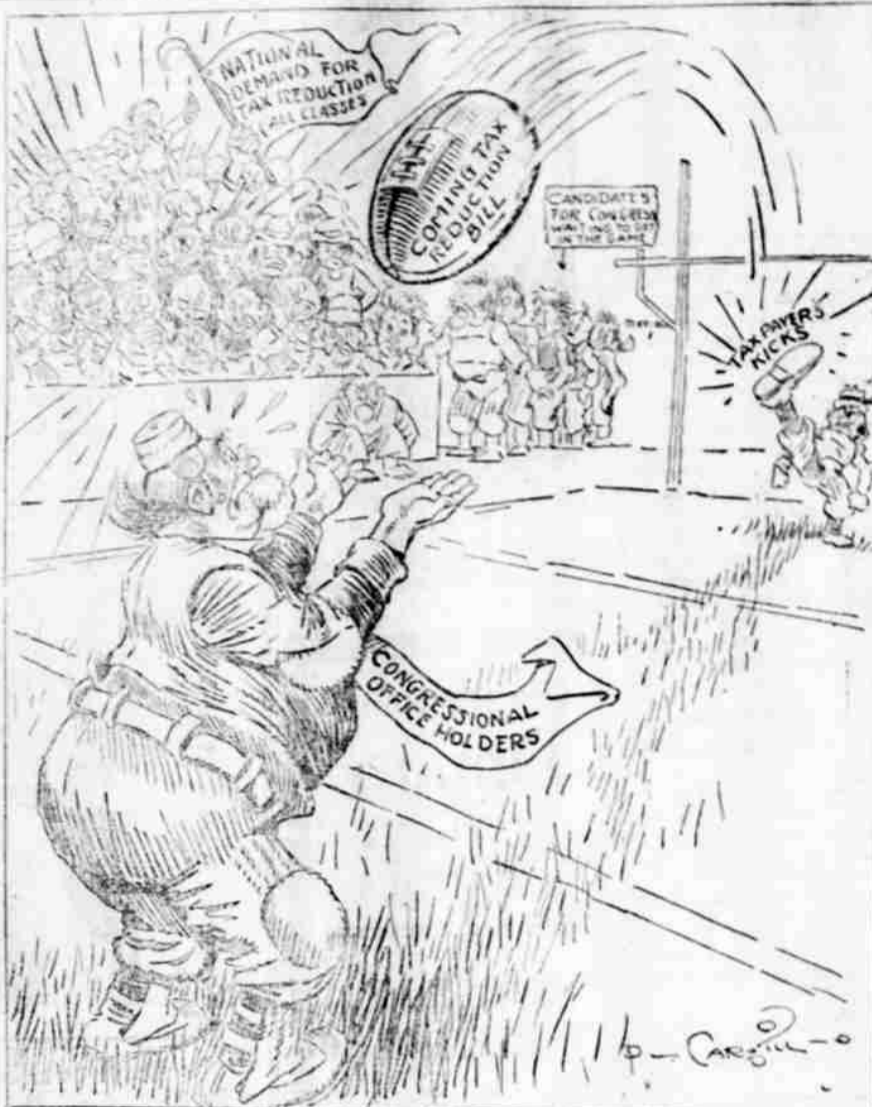
## LIABILITY FOR FIRE CARELESSNESS

Personal liability for damages arising from fire on account of the alleged gross carelessness of another will be given its first test in the courts of Georgia as a result of the filing of one of the few suits of its kind, in the Bibb county superior court. The petition, instituted by the Macon Cabinet Works against the Southern Box and Basket company, for damages of \$17,000, is of particular interest for the reason that insurance companies and officials and citizens of Macon are working in conjunction to reduce the normal burning ration of Macon.

Mass meetings of civic bodies and citizens have been held to correct conditions that will result in increasing insurance rates if not abated, and the city courts are invoking fire hazard laws and assessing heavy fines for their violation.
