own seven-yard line and Wetzel punted out of bounds on the 20-yard line. The California backs rolled through until Jabs fumbled and Wetzel recovered the ball on his own 7-yard line. He punted, and the ball again went out of bounds on the 24-yard line. California pounded the ball to the 13-yard line, and a trick play then put Jabs over for the second touchdown.

Again in the third quarter Wetzel punted from his six-yard line, and the ball was short. California got it on Oregon's 25-yard line. Line backs took it to the two-yard line as the quarter ended. Then Perrin crashed the ball across in the fourth period. A fumble by Anderson of Oregon in the fourth quarter, when he received a punt, gave the Bears their fourth chance to score. California recovered the ball near midfield and marched towards the goal. Will made 13 yards and Jabs 16 yards. The backs gained consistently. Finally Perrin ran six yards and crossed the goal for the last touchdown.

Treatment, Parasitic Diseases of Sheep. For the truck and grain farmer there are: Crimson Clover Utilization, Seed Production and Growing of Crimson Clover, Burr Clover, Red Clover Culture, Sweet Clover, Utilization of the Clovers, Harvesting and Threshing Sweet Clover Seed, Timothy and What Makes the Price of Oats. For the horticulturist: Apple Orchard Rejuvenation, Manufacture of Apple Juice and Tree Borers and Their Control. For the owner or raiser of horses are: the following bulletins offer a world of aid: Breaking and Training Colts, Horse Breeding Suggestions, Breeds of Draft Horses, Horse Feeding, Horse Power and Management in Farm Work, How to Select a Sound Horse, Male Production.
