or description, and any attitude that I may have at the present time towards the railroad program are entirely my own ideas and opinions. Neither have I been approached by any individual or group of individuals who have at any time been outspokenly in favor of the S. P. program to the exclusion of the Northern lines. If my readers will kindly refer to my platform published in another part of this paper and which I originally published in the Klamath News under date of Sept. 25, they will find that I have spoken as being in favor of the Northern lines. On this platform I still stand.

If I am elected to the council, the railroad program will receive my careful and earnest attention and action taken upon it to the best of my ability and reasoning powers.

On the subject of the city parks, I might say that the management and control of the parks is in the hands of the park board and the council can only dispose of this property upon the recommendations of the board. That as far as I can learn there has been no attempt on the part of the council or the park board to dispose of this land to the detriment of the Northern lines, or to the detriment of the people of the city of Klamath Falls.

prove of a bill for an ordinance which had for its purpose the hiring of C. C. Kennedy, California construction engineer, that he might make a preliminary sewer survey of the city for a consideration of \$1500. Conceding that Mr. Kennedy might be entirely competent, the council held that it might not wish to employ him for the actual work, following the survey, as provided in the ordinance, and in consequence, rejected it.

At last night's meeting the resignation of Dr. A. A. Soule, as a member of the boxing commission, was received and accepted, and Dr. G. S. Newsom, director of the county health unit, was named to succeed him.

Francis R. Olds, commander of the local post, American Legion, appeared before the aldermen last night and verbally requested that \$250 from the fund received from the boxing commission be turned over to the local post that it might be used in the building of its gymnasium in the new memorial building now under construction. The council, however, held that the money should be used for playground work, and Mr. Olds' request was not acted on favorably.

L. E. Sullivan was engaged, at the suggestion of Fire Chief Keith Ambrose. His salary was placed at \$125 a month. A new fireman was found necessary as a result of a vacancy recently created. A request from John McCall, postmaster, that an arc light be placed at the corner of Ninth and Main streets, was referred to the light committee.

Considerable routine business of little consequence was transacted at last night's meeting.

DOVE OF PEACE HANGS OVER TEXAS EXECUTIVE

AUSTIN, Texas, Oct. 26.—(United News)—The dove of peace, its wings slightly scorched, again flies over the state capitol and Governor Miriam A. Ferguson apparently has emerged victorious, temporarily, at least, in a thrilling word battle with her enemies.

A truce in the verbal warfare was attributed simultaneously with the return Monday of Lee Satterwhite, from Washington, where he had gone to confer with treasury officials regarding tax problems. Satterwhite had threatened to call an immediate special session of the lawmakers to investigate all state departments unless the woman governor acted.

After a conference with Attorney General Dan Moody, who is directing the investigation into the activities of the state highway department, however, Satterwhite announced he would not issue the legislative call until Moody's work was completed.

WAMBY'S MAJOR LEAGUE DAYS ENDED, REPORT

CLEVELAND, Oct. 26.—(United News)—Bill Wambagans, the hero of the world series of 1920, was cast from major league baseball Monday, when waivers were requested by the Boston Red Sox. Wamby has played with Boston for several years. The other clubs in the major league seemed uninterested in Wamby, as they allowed the request for waivers to expire, and the vet second baseman was informed that his big league days were ended. Wamby is famed as the only player who ever performed an unassisted triple play in a world series game.

SETS SEAPLANE RECORD

BALTIMORE, Oct. 26.—Lieut. James Doolittle of the army set a new world speed record for seaplanes and won for the United States a second leg on the Jacques Schneider seaplane trophy in the international seaplane races at Bay Shore Monday afternoon.

Leading the field on each lap, Doolittle rounded the seven laps of the fifty kilometer course at an average speed of 232.573 miles an hour, which was 43.753 miles an hour faster than a previous unofficial world record for seaplanes set by Lieut. Ralph Oistle at Bay Shore a year ago.

SPEEDER FINED
