CHARITY ALMOST LOSES ON BOUTS

NEW YORK, Oct. 27.—(United News)—There will be no more all-star charity boxing shows here which will net sweet charity some such sum as \$4,500.

Charity has almost lost money on some of these cards in the past, but now the New York boxing commission has decided that promoters will be required to put aside at least 50 per cent of the gross receipts of any such exhibition for the charity involved.

Furthermore the promoter must turn the amount over to the commission, which undertakes to see that it gets to the charity.

The commission acted to end repetition of farces in which the name of charity had been taken in vain, so that the boxers might walk off with most of the receipts, leaving charity in the lurch.

The commission also increased the pay of judges and referees.

The old rate was \$15 for a judge and \$25 for a referee. A sliding scale has been instituted now, with a \$50 minimum for a referee and \$25 for a judge. In championship bouts referees will get \$200 and each judge \$100, while in all shows drawing more than \$20,000 the referee draws \$100, and the judges \$50 apiece.
