

# TRAMBITAS WINS IN SEATTLE BOUT

### Battler, Booked to Fight Starkey Here on Nov. 3 Surprises Fans

Johnny Trambitas, who is to fight Kid Starkey, in the Scandinavian hall here in the 10-round main event on November 3, surprised the Seattle fans, when he won easily over Sam Anderson in a six-round bout there Tuesday night. The footwork of Trambitas surprised Anderson a whole lot more than it did the fans who saw the bout. Johnny is to be here about Friday, when he will do a little light work in preparation for his bout with Starkey.

The work of Trambitas in Seattle was described by the sport writers of that city as fast. The bout, which preceded the main event between Vic Foley and Joe Lynch, made a hit with the fans there. So it is with some keen anticipation that the Klamath Falls lovers of the fistie art, await the coming of Trambitas to this city.

In the meantime Starkey is losing no ground. He is not by any means letting his mitts grow mouldy, for he knows he may have a hard man to crack in the November 3 mill.

Earl Stolz, who is to fight Chuck Sams a return match in the six-round semi-windup, is scheduled to be here today. In the last bout between these two on Oct. 20, both put up a corking exhibition, going to a draw, the fans giving them a great hand during the go and when it was over. At first Earl deceived the local fans, before whom he appeared for the first time in this city. He does not have the appearance of a hard glove shover, but the fact is, he's dynamite any time he gets a chance.

W. Harrington, rated the fastest 140-pounder in this section, has been matched with Jack Crim. Matchmaker Sylvester said both men besieged him to give them a go at each other, so he matched them up. Crim went on during the last card here in the preliminaries with Sol Dean and gave a good account of himself.

some one as yet not signed, took a look at the card advertising himself and others, yesterday, then scratched his head, while over his countenance spread an expression of deep thought and ponderance.

NEWMARKET, Eng., Oct. 28.—(United News)—A. K. McComber's Masked Marvel brought off one of the richest coups in racing history Wednesday by taking the classic Cambridgeshire stakes by a length, and thereby winning its American owner and an unnamed friend almost half a million dollars on a parley. McComber was enriched by \$250,000, and his friend, who had parleyed the same horses, gained \$137,500.
