FORT KLAMATH, Oct. 29.—Timber cut from the forests of the Klamath reservation for the past nine months, up to and including September 30, has a total value of \$822,212.29, according to figures given out by L. D. Arnold, Indian agent. Twelve companies are operating. Money collected from them in advance of operations against the expected scale totaled \$890,664.81, and the timber scaled was 174,852,620 feet.

GAS WAR WON BY FUEL COMPANIES

PIERRE, S. D., Oct. 29.—United News—The spectacular South Dakota gasoline price war that raged for more than two years—at one time driving gasoline down to 12 cents a gallon when it was selling elsewhere for 20 cents—has been won, temporarily, at least, by the oil companies.

The state supreme court Wednesday decided that the state adopted an unlawful role when it entered the filling station business and granted an injunction restraining South Dakota from making any more sales.

Injunction proceedings were started by the White Eagle Oil & Refining company, many of whose filling stations had been forced to close up after unsuccessful competition with the stations operated by the government. Specifically the high court ruled that the act of the legislature authorizing the governor and the gasoline board to use state funds to finance their fight on privately owned oil companies was unconstitutional. State officials may appeal to the United States supreme court.

SILENT PLANE TO ENTERTAIN FARES

SAN DIEGO, Calif., Oct. 28.—A new airplane which glides so smoothly through the skies that passengers may talk to each other in ordinary conversational tones has been built here at a cost of \$40,000.

The "cloudster" as it is called will carry 14 passengers at a rate of 115 miles an hour. It is equipped with a radio receiving set for entertaining its "fares" and will be used on a new passenger air line between San Diego and northern California cities.

Friday morning Mayor John L. Bacon and the city air board are going up in the "cloudster" for a trial flight.
