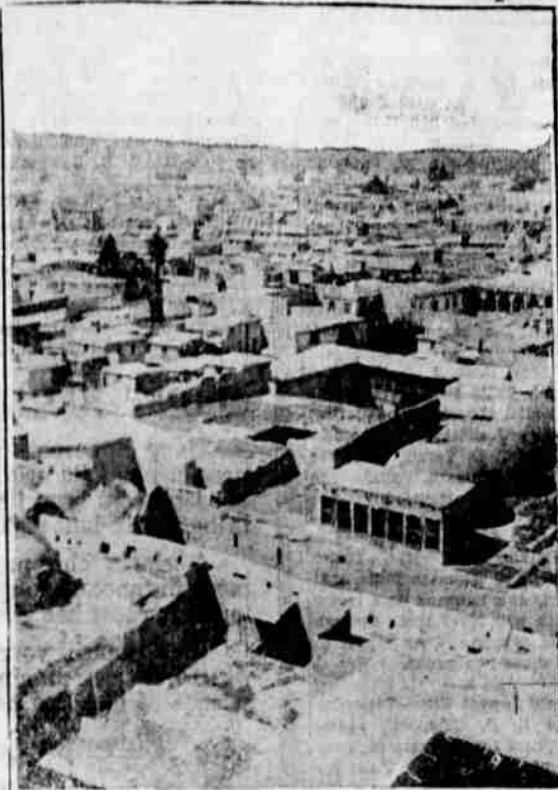

## Mussolini of Persia Ousts Rule of Shah

LONDON, Oct. 31.—The Teheran correspondent of the weekly Dispatch reported today that Risa Khan, the "Mussolini of Persia," had succeeded in ousting the shah definitely and in obtaining sovereign powers for himself pending establishment of a new form of government in Persia.

The shah is now believed to be in southern Europe, ostensibly for his health but in reality a sort of exile.

## Owens Sentenced to 18 Month Jail Term

If the sentence imposed yesterday on T. M. Owens is not commuted, or if, prior to that time, he does not receive some unlooked for assistance, T. M. Owens must serve 18 months behind the gray walls of the Oregon state penitentiary.

Circuit Judge Leavitt yesterday morning sentenced Owens to a year and a half in prison following Owens' conviction on a statutory charge.

Owens was accused of being criminally intimate with Emily Hudack, a 17-year-old girl. The offense was alleged to have been committed near Pelican City some time ago.

## FIREMAN DIES FROM INJURIES IN WRECK

AUBURN, N. Y., Oct. 31.—John Stack, 26, fireman, died at Mercy hospital as a result of a wreck on the Lehigh Valley railroad seven miles south of here tonight.

Edward H. Smith, engineer, and 12 passengers were brought here in automobiles to be treated for injuries, none of which were serious.

## REVOLT SPREADING TO ARAB TRIBES, REPORT

LONDON, Oct. 31.—Insurrection against the French in Syria is spreading to the Arab tribes around Deirzozor, Alaupo, and Palmyra, according to dispatches from Cairo.

The Arabs are reported to be sending their women and children toward the Syrian desert, which would indicate that they are preparing to rebel. One report states that Deirzozor already is in the hands of the rebels, who attacked and compelled the French to evacuate four villages north of Damas-

## Cement Head Comes Too Late for Warden

CHICAGO, Oct. 30.—"Cement head," the new insanity plea introduced in an attempt to save former Warden Wesley Westbrook from a prison sentence in connection with his part in the Cook county jail graft, was rejected Friday by Federal Judge James H. Wilkerson.

The judge held that "cement head" might be a form of insanity for all he knew about such things, but that it was now too late to reopen the jail scandal hearing in which Westbrook was accused of taking large bribes from wealthy prisoners.
