LIVING STANDARD STATE'S PROBLEM

Prominent Health Worker of Oregon Outlines Vital Age of Humanity

Of paramount interest to members of the Klamath County Public Health association, was the annual dinner, reports and discussion by Mrs. Sadie Orr-Dunbar, enjoyed last night in the chamber of commerce rooms. Using a blackboard to carry out her work, Mrs. Dunbar demonstrated the work of the public health associations and their origin. Another chart also portrayed in vivid form, the death rate of persons from ten years to 45 years of age, who have succumbed to tuberculosis. "This alone should give you an incentive to work with children and young persons to prevent the destruction of life at this period, when homes are made and families are founded," said Mrs. Dunbar. "In outlining the work for 1926 don't forget that the age group from 10 to 45 years of age is the vital age, and to raise the standard of living that age must be safeguarded from the dreaded tuberculosis." A brief discussion of the campaign that may soon be started throughout the state, in the installation of a second tuberculosis hospital, to be located in eastern Oregon, was also brought out by Mrs. Dunbar in her vitally interesting talk. The address of welcome was given by Fred E. Fleet, president of the Klamath county association. Reports from E. M. Hubb, treasurer, who gave figures of \$492.05 remaining in the treasury, as balance on hand from the county health unit, were followed by Mrs. Bart Hawkins of the nurses' committee, and Mrs. J. C. Boyle of the supply committee. Officers of the association who have served in the past year were re-elected. Mrs. Francis R. Olds pleased with a vocal solo, as did a quartette consisting of Mrs. Olds, Miss Eloise McPherson, Wayne Akers and Lynn Sabin, following a report by Dr. G. S. Newson on the work of the county health unit.

"Yet, I venture the prediction that the incoming congress will prove to be one of the most efficient mediums for the translation of the popular will into legislation in many years." The house, he said, has already completed its organization and assignments, and is in perfect accord with President Coolidge. "We are as a unit on questions of tax reduction and reform, including rigid economy. Regarding President Coolidge, Longworth said: "We think of him as the right man in the right place. If I might use a colloquialism, we think that he is a square peg in a square hole, and that he just about fits it."
