PADLOCKS CLICK AS RAIDERS HIT

Great White Way of N. Y. Hears Close of Many New Shiny Padlocks

NEW YORK, Nov. 20.—Padlocks clicked along the gay white way Friday as 13 night clubs capitulated before the dry drive begun by Emory C. Buckner, United States attorney and agreed to close voluntarily for periods ranging from six months to a year.
