effect an agreement on disarmament,  
so is the risk of war greater.

Nobody believes that a war can  
arise over a quarrel in the Rhine  
valley. Where the war will arise is  
nearer the Danube than the Rhine.  
The lighting of the match will take  
place, if it takes place at all, in  
middle and eastern Europe.

Therefore, when we look at the  
map of Europe, we see what a tre-  
mendous hinterland of war risks is  
still left untouched. In that hinter-  
land of small nations, rent and riven  
with racial troubles, economic  
troubles, religious troubles and po-  
litical troubles and jealousies, Lo-  
carno cannot be applied. We have  
to remember that the hinterland has  
to be covered in some way with  
peace and security.

The pact, the spirit of the pact,  
the psychological effect of the pact,  
is going to advance us substantially,  
I hope, in the way of peace.

These criticisms I have made are  
in the nature of developments, and  
the taking of opportunities, which  
the pact undoubtedly presents to  
Europe.

But the best tribute that can be  
paid to any really substantial piece  
of work is to look at it with one eye  
very sympathetically, and with the  
other eye very critically.
